The Groundbreaking Ceremony for Chosen Vision's future DeWitt home for six developmentally disabled women took place on the morning of July 25, 2011.

Residents, parents, board members and city officials were in attendance to celebrate Chosen Vision's commitment to build and operate their second home.

Adrienne Motz and Amy Russell, who will be the first residents of Chosen Vision - DeWitt, smiled with joy as they watched the morning's activities with great anticipation.

After much prayer and due diligence, the board of Chosen Vision decided to move forward with its plans to build the six-resident home with \$180,000 yet to be raised. We have secured enough funding to begin and fully complete the home's exterior through drywall stage.

As we continue to seek funding through grants from applicable foundations, we will continue to solicit funding for Chosen Vision – DeWitt one room at a time. As the home building progresses, we will be bringing you up-to-date, as well as offering tours to our donors and prospective residents.

When completed, the home will be approximately 3800 square feet and will house six developmentally disabled women with their own bedroom and bathroom as well as living quarters for staff and caregivers.

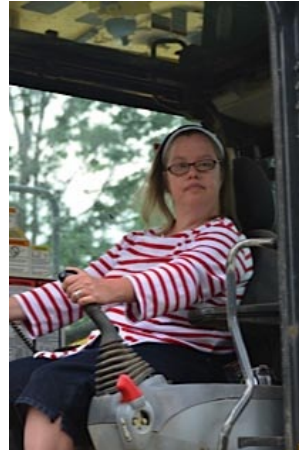

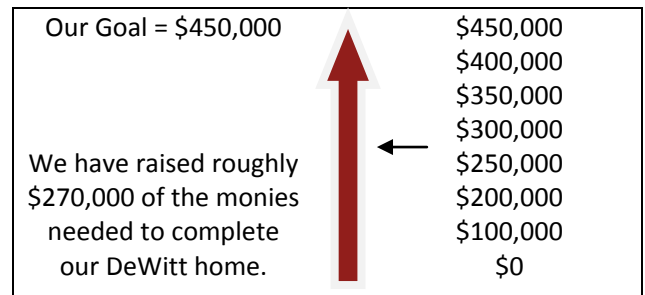
